Eve Babitz is a writer like no other—she "is to prose what Chet Baker is to jazz" (Vanity Fair)—and she has influenced a generation of writers and readers with her sophisticated, witty, and delightful work.

With six out-of-print books reissued in 2015, L.A. writer Eve Babitz has become an "Unlikely Icon For Millennial Women" (Bazaar) and a "Millenial #Girlcrush" (LA Weekly).

A party girl, artist, bookworm, writer, journalist, and muse, Eve's life in Southern California was as vibrant and freewheeling as her prose. Her recent passing in December 2021 inspired an outpouring from fans across the internet, as profiled by The New York Times.

"A child of Hollywood, she wrote of the sensuous pleasures of Los Angeles, and sampled them enthusiastically," the Times wrote of Eve Babitz.

Her agent, Erica Silverman, said to the Times, "She was writing about women in a way that doesn't exist anymore. A new generation is responding to her abandon and her grit. I think women no longer have that kind of freedom. Eve never saw herself as a victim. She was a free spirit and living her life the way want she wanted to."

Eve Babitz has been translated into **Danish**, **Dutch**, **French**, **German**, **Italian**, **Japanese**, **Norwegian**, Polish, Spanish, and Turkish.

However, despite the arrest of the three traitors—there were whispers of a fourth spy still running free, seventy years after their traitorous act—but they were nothing more than rumors, until very recently.

Codenamed PERSEUS, references to a fourth agent were found throughout transcripts from VENONA, a top-secret U.S. counterintelligence program, and memoirs of former Soviet intelligence officers, but with the FBI's release of tens of thousands of previously classified documents in 2011, came the final piece of the puzzle. Hidden among the declassified material was the identity of the fourth spy: Oscar Seborer and three of his brothers.

- 3. Why aren't Western governments trying to recover the art and prosecute the thieves?
- 4. Why is this important?

Pezzullo's boots-on-the ground investigation – supported by his network of contacts who swim in the murky waters of international crime and intrigue – will take readers to Norway, Sweden, England, France, and ultimately China, where they will track down the stolen art and talk to collectors, criminal gangs, law enforcement officials and experts to determine how the thefts are being commissioned and executed, what the Chinese are thinking, and the history behind the items taken.
